Secretary's Report-Robin Danielson

The Secretary's Report was shared via email, NDQHA Facebook page & on the NDHA website prior to the meeting.Laurel Rohrer made a motion to accept the Secretary's Report, seconded by Vicky Borgen, motion carried.

Treasurer's Report-Katherine Beaudine

National Director's Reports

Scott Flach-Financials

Scott announced that a new facility is being built in Burleigh County near the Missouri River Fairgrounds.

AQHA is doing a soft launch of the new member portion of the website called" My AQHA" in February.

AQHA foal registrations & horse show entries increased in 2022.Bringing three years of positive numbers.

AQHA financials unaudited financials are at \$48 million. Up 1.3 from 2021.

Connie Armstrong-Show Committee

Connie walked us through finding our leveling on the AQHA website. She included the 2023 Class point ranges. She recommended that the NDQHA members download the 2023 Rule Book. All members were encouraged to print off their L1 eligibility for themselves & their horses prior to the start of the show season. You will be required to show proof of eligibility when you register at the shows.

Doreen Swenson-Youth Committee

Doreen serves on the AQHA Youth Committee. AQHA offers a variety of programs for the youth including: Junior Master Horseman, Horse Study Racing Experience, Stall Decorating at the AQHA Youth World Show, Art, ScrapBook, Speeches, Collegiate Judging (Paige Brummund is currently attending with her youth group) YES conference, horseback riding program among others. Youth are encouraged to participate. There is still time to apply for scholarships. 35 youth are currently in the young horse development program.

Dawn Martin-Ranching Committee(John Hovde)

Dawn Martin reported that AQHA is adding an International Heritage Breeder Award. Breakaway & Steer Stopping have been added as approved AQHA classes.

There is a possibility of being a Canadian Ranching Heritage Challenge.

North Dakota has 11 Ranching Heritage Breeders.

As of November AQHA requires a 6 panel test on all breeding stallions. MYHM has been added. YOu can currently add that test for \$20.

Digital Registration certificates may become the standard for AQHA.

AQHA will be honoring the 50 Year Cumulative Breeders at the AQHA Convention.

Amateur Report-Lesley Foss

Lesley reported that the Amateur Association voted to donate \$1000 to the NDQHA Futurity, \$1000 to Region 2, \$1000 to Versatility Ranch Show & \$1000 to the Missouri River Show to be used towards the AQHA classes. Minimum Judges Requirement for NDQHA Year End Awards

President Rylan Sundsbak announced the change in the way we calculate year end eligibility. The NDQHA BOD voted to use the formula of 50%+1 of the total approved judges, rounding up if the number of judges offered was even. Discussion was held by the membership.

Connie Armstrong made a motion to change the requirement to 9 judges, seconded by Ryane Bakke. Further discussion was held concerning the classes that aren't offered at every approved show. Jodee Hass moved to amend the motion to include an adjustment for those classes to be eligible at 50%+1 of approved judges offered, seconded by Ryanne. Motion Carried. 50% + 1 classes include:Weanlings,2 Year Old, Longeline,Walk Trot, Ranch Trail, L1 Open Reining, Versatility Ranch Horse & Leadline.
